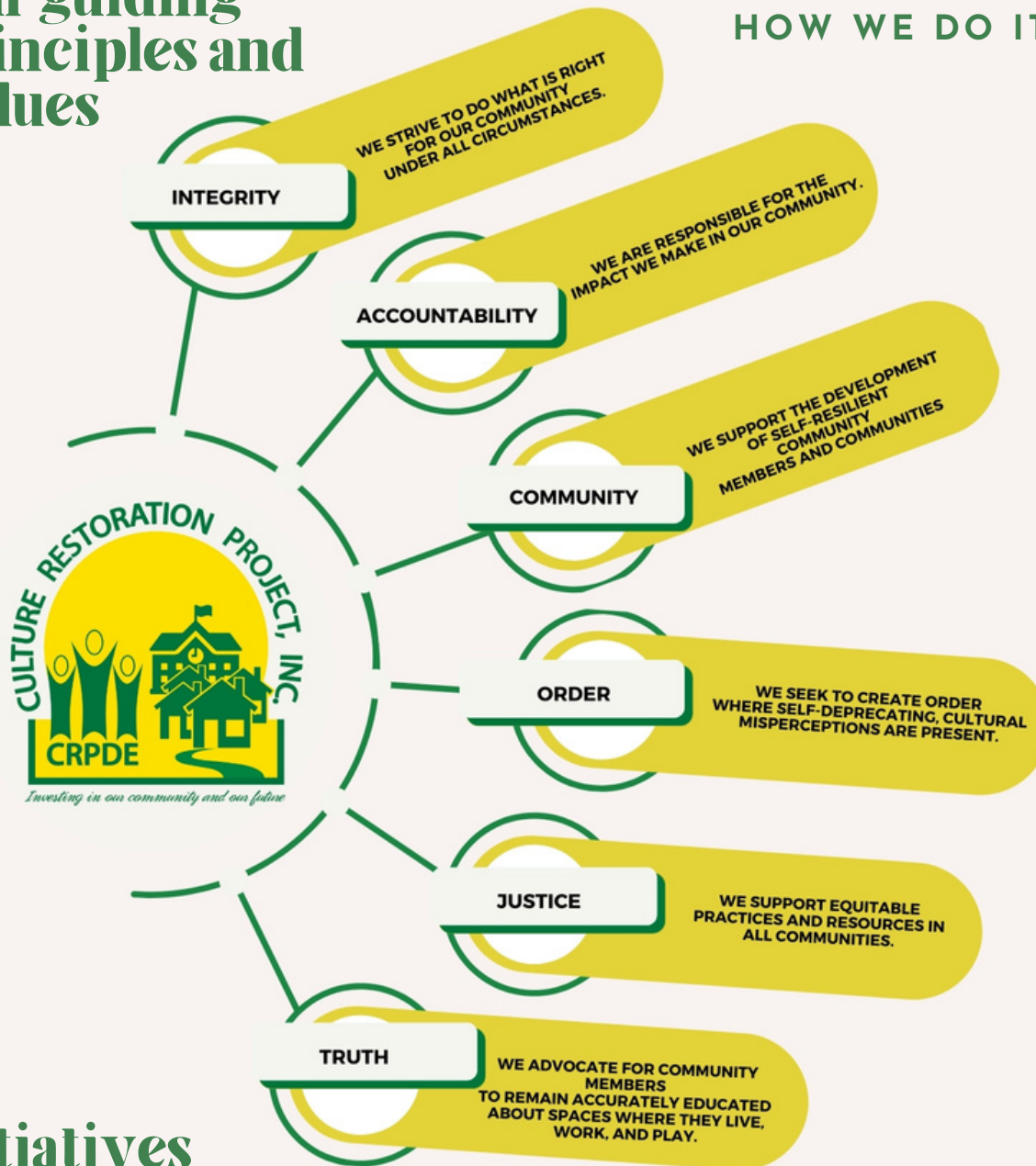

Mr. Martinez is currently facilitating Beyond Those Bars programs at several locations in Wilmington, Delaware. We are excited to have this dynamic teacher and artist on our team!

Beyond Those Bars (BTB) is a hip-hop-based Project and Learner-Based cultural enrichment program. BTB utilizes hip-hop culture and African-centered modalities to introduce students to empowerment tools through history education, cultural awareness, and engagement in the arts.

Through guided lessons and activities, students build critical thinking and coping skills while receiving educational support from a culturally relevant and responsive perspective.

BTB Teen Artist Development



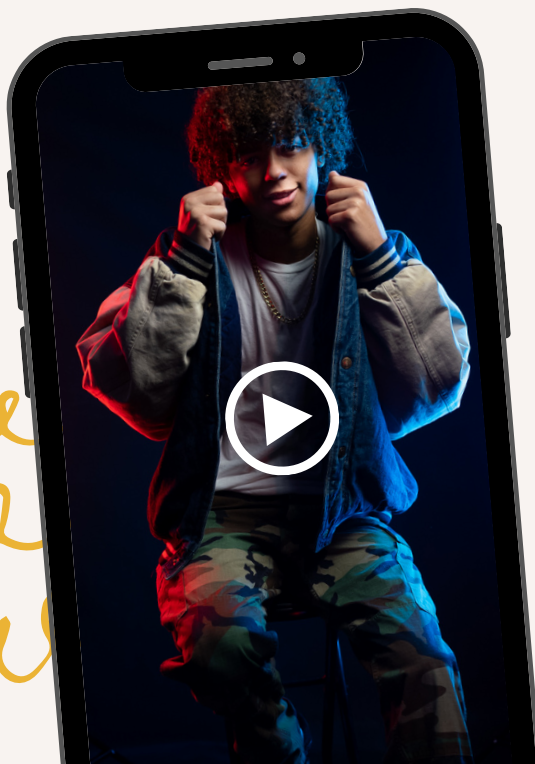
As BTB students matriculate through the program, they build skills in the 3-C's - Confidence, Communication, and Character.

We encourage the development of reading and writing skills and urge students to become purposeful contributors to their communities.

In the program, students work collectively to select one community/social issue to address through song. Students then use their song to educate their communities and inspire social change.

BTB Teen Artist Development is a professional development program for high-risk teen artists. Participants engage in 1:1 sessions with professional artists who assist them with songwriting, beat making, music recording, performance skills, marketing, and more!

At the end of the program, participating teens have a complete 6-song project uploaded to all streaming platforms that they can market and sell. All costs are covered by CRP, Inc.



Participants receive:

- Professional Songwriting Instruction
- Music Business Training
- Budget and Money Management Training
- Studio Recording Time
- Production Assistance (with the opportunity to produce, market, and digitally release a complete project)

NEW PROGRAM

Queen Code is a self-affirming, culturally responsive program that uses cultural tenants to support young girls as they develop critical thinking and healthy decision-making skills. Young queens join a sisterhood of supportive peers and a network of positive role models who work together to dismantle unhealthy, unrealistic projections and propaganda. Students develop leadership skills and envision how they can make a positive impact on the world around them.



QUEEN CODE CIRCLES

A structured support group for girls ages 9-18 which integrates relational theory, resiliency practices, and skills training. Queen Code Circles are designed to increase positive connection, strength, and competence in young girls.

PARTNERING WITH SCHOOLS & COMMUNITY CENTERS

Kulture Keepers is a Virtues-based youth enrichment program that utilizes arts and culture to promote leadership and character-building skills. Through interactive experiences, students build critical thinking and social skills from a culturally relevant and responsive perspective.

Students have agency over their activities and arts projects, all based on positive relationship building, positive self-identity, and social/civic engagement.

PROCESSING INFORMATION IS A PART OF THE HEALING WORK!

Students are able to slow down and process the vast amount of information that they encounter daily in order to determine what is true, what is false, and what is designed as a tool of influence (both positive and negative). Ultimately, students create original written pieces, (which can be in the form of monologues, short stories, poems, etc.) that become the content they use for professionally filmed Public Service Announcements. When time allows, students are able to compile their written work into an anthology that can serve as a learning tool for other students.

Knowledge of Self (KOS) is a Project and Learner-based culture-centered enrichment program that focuses on developing the self-concept or “self-knowledge” of participating students (self-knowledge is the information that children draw upon when answering the question “What am I like?”). Students are introduced to tools of empowerment through community resources, history, culture, the arts, and hands-on projects that address false perceptions and misconstructions that young people internalize about themselves, their peers, and other community members.

KOS addresses contradictions in what is seen on television, in social media, and elsewhere in society, providing students the opportunity to think critically and develop their own healthy concepts about themselves and the world around them.

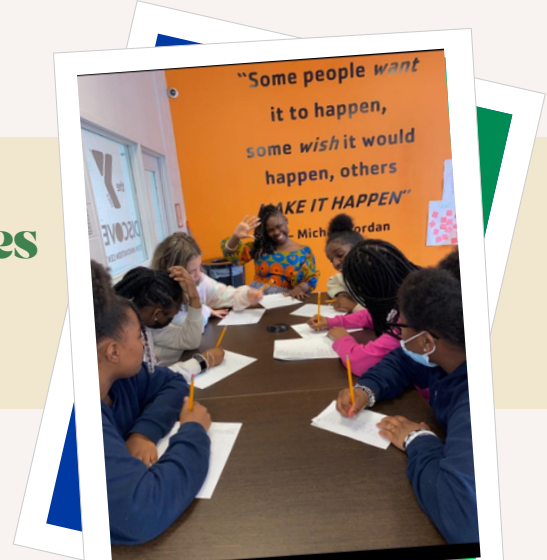


Poetry, Prose & Power (P3) is a trauma-informed series of multimedia creative writing and life coaching workshops that are culturally competent, therapeutic, self-affirming outlets for middle and high school age girls. In P3, students are introduced to engagement that pulls from proven African/African American, Hispanic/Latinx, and Indigenous educational and healing modalities that are encouraging, engaging, and valuable to young people of all nationalities, cultures, and ethnicities. Poetry and prose are used to tell stories, help students cope, and as a tool to unite through shared experiences.
